- The **simulation pharmacy** is an extension of the **Katz Family Healthcare Simulation Center** and offers a unique hospital and retail simulated environment.
- **Small class sizes** taught by **experienced** pharmacists and pharmacy technicians.
- The program is a mix of **classroom** education, **online learning**, **laboratory simulation** and **clinical** site experiences.

Program Description

The pharmacy technician, under the supervision of a pharmacist, assists in day-to-day pharmacy operations. Pharmacy technicians work in hospitals or retail pharmacies receiving written prescriptions, taking prescription refill requests, preparing intravenous medications, operating computer and automation systems, applying prescription and auxiliary labels to medication bottles, pricing and controlling inventory, and preparing insurance claim forms. Successful completion of the program will include 48 hours of clinical rotations at hospital and retail pharmacies.

Graduates are eligible to take a national pharmacy technician certification exam, which is required for employment as a pharmacy technician in Iowa and many other states.

Students in this program can apply credits toward an A.A.S. degree in Medical Assisting.
